Crime Prevention Week



Crime Prevention Week in Ontario has been designated November 2nd-8th, 2008. The Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services will place emphasis on community safety and crime prevention during this annual event. "Invest in Your Future: Prevent Crime" is this year's theme and it will help enhance our group efforts to build safer and stronger communities. By promoting personal and public safety in the province through prevention, preparedness and social development the Police, Government and communities will be encouraged to continue to work together. This will help create strategies to address local issues and to reduce overall crime in Ontario. CPAT has applied for the Safer and Vital Communities (SVC) grant which encourages community partnerships by providing a one time funding for local projects and initiatives to help prevent and reduce crime. The SVC grant is only available to community based non profit organizations like CPAT. Crime Prevention Week is an excellent opportunity to shine light on CPAT and our successful partners, like the Toronto Police Service (TPS), and how police and communities work together to help prevent and reduce crime and increase the overall well being of community safety. CPAT will be participating in Crime Prevention Week by attending the launch at TPS Headquarters, participating in crime prevention and community mobilization courses and partnering with a police division to educate seniors on crime prevention.
